Belgium formally bans non-essential travel outside the European Union, the Schengen area and the United Kingdom. This measure is in force until further notice. These countries are considered as red zones

Each person who returns to Belgium from any foreign country or who wishes to stay in Belgium for more than 48 hours will have to fill in an identification form (Passenger Locator Form) <https://travel.info-coronavirus.be/fr/public-health-passenger-locator-form>

LEGAL OBLIGATIONS WHEN YOU RETURN
Mandatory quarantine and screening when you return from all countries outside the EU and the Schengen area and from all red zones
Obligation to contact your general practitioner and mention your travel history in order to undergo testing.

Quarantine and screening are recommended

Contact tracing: slowing down the virus together

Contact tracing is one of the measures to prevent the spread of the virus.

A staff member of the authorities will call you. It is important that you answer the questions as fully as possible: He or she will ask you about the list of contacts you drew up.

Those data will be treated confidentially
